For more than 15 years, Cristian Subirà has been an active member of Barcelona's underground music scene; promoting shows, releasing tapes, playing in bands (Dead Man on Campus, Coconot, Narwhal, Maresme,...), hiding behind different monikers (Summer Recreation Camp, Nubian Deli, Venessa Milano and Tim Robertson) or co-founding dublab.es.

At his back more than 150 solo live shows around Europe and the United States sharing stage with Lucky Dragons, Daniel Higgs, Ariel Kalma, Joanne Robertson, The Space Lady, Julianna Barwick, Maria Minerva, Zbigniew Karkowski, White Magic, Pedro Magina or MANS O, aside appearances in festivals such as Sonar, Primavera Club, LEM, Grec, Meakusma, Atonal Berlin, Online Radio Festival Amsterdam, Milhoes de Festa or Baleapop.

Subira's sound explorations navigate on and around new age, ambient and drone, always trying to build a porous bridge between them. A final construction where is easy you listen to the huge influence that Brian Eno, Roedelius, Hiroshi Yoshimura, Benjamin Lew, Craig Kupka or Vini Reilly had in him.


